- Bring a paragraph or more about yourself and what you want to say about your art. (Read other bios online to get ideas if uncertain where to begin)

Being prepared when you arrive will help us get the process complete quickly and have your information up on the AFAF Website ASAP. Then you can put that information on your business cards, flyers, etc.

If you cannot make the event and would still like to update your information please email Jude the text you would like for your bio, a picture of yourself and a maximum of 7 pictures of your artwork - with the names for each piece. Spots are available on a first-contact/first-reserved basis.

Oil Pastel Drawing for Kids: Kids, bring out your creativity with Oil pastels. Learn to create contrasts, blend colors, draw textures, and forms. Different subjects will be explored during this four week course.

May I have a Receipt Please...

Those working the gallery, it's important to always write a receipt for items sold. Doing so in the proper manner makes sure that the treasurer and the artist are properly informed and compensated.

- 1. Always note the buyer information (Name/Address/Phone/and License if they write a check) in case a question comes up or there is a problem.
- 1ADescribe the Art Piece, Use Inventory Number if available and write the Artists name (or the family name if that's what's noted on the piece being sold some memberships are family memberships) this helps payment get to the right person.
- 2. Write the check number if it's a check.
- 3. Write Credit Card Payment if you run it through their credit card.
- 4. Write "Cash" if it's a cash payment.
- 5. Write "Donation" if the art piece states "donation" on it those dollars will then go to AFAF writing Donation on it is the only way the treasurer knows how to handle.
- 6. One receipt stays in the book, one copy goes to the customer, and one copy goes in the cashbox (which color goes where is noted on the book).
- 7. Always include TAX the only exceptions are donations, membership or hanging fees those do not require tax. Current tax is 7%.

When in doubt, an example of a proper receipt is posted behind the desk.

- 1. The "Open" flag goes into a slot at the outer edge of the big ART GALLERY sign.
- 2. In the appropriate column in the Work Schedule book, mark how many visitors you had. Mark "O" if there were none.
- 3. Receipts for sales must show the name of the artist, the title of the work or the inventory number if there is no title.
- ${\bf 4.}\ \ {\bf Artists'}\ works\ left\ at\ the\ gallery\ are\ stored\ in\ the\ room\ to\ the\ right\ of\ the\ restroom.$
- 5. Turn the thermostat by the restroom door down to 62 65 when you leave. Thank you! Bernita
