Congratulations Dennis Downes!

It was a beautiful spring day for the Ceremony of the Installation & Blessing of the Bronze Trail Marker Tree Sculpture by Artist & Author Dennis Downes. This beautiful and meaningful sculpture purchased by the Village of Antioch is now permanently placed and on display on Main Street.

Dennis was accompanied by many family and friends that came from near and far who shared in this special occasion. The ceremony opened to a very large crowd with Master of Ceremony Gail Spreen. Antioch Mayor Lawrence Hanson eloquently spoke how this Trail Tree, as a work of art, "reflects on the roots and symbolism of community". Chicago Alderman Brian Hopkins stated that this "public art is an investment for the future". That "great public art lasts for generations". With Emmy award winning producer, director and cameraman Gary Donatelli filming the event to Andrew Johnson, Cherokee, President, Native American Chamber of Commerce of IL blessing the Trail Tree Sculpture this was a very memorable event. Others who spoke to Dennis' lifelong passion of researching, sharing and educating about the importance in history of the Native American Trail Marker Trees included Liz Fox, Dennis' Assistant and Amy Blue from the Antioch Public Library.

A very special guest, Hilda "Little Fawn" Williams, Native American Elder presented Dennis with an extraordinary gift, a recitation of a very personal poem, "The Vanishing Race" and was an emotional moment.

Dennis shared how Lake County, IL has one of the most well-recorded histories of the Native American Trail Marker Trees in the Great Lakes region going back as far as the 1800's.

Using Yupo Paper or Tile as a substrate, steps she uses to adhere yupo paper or photos onto a wood panel (cradled birchwood).

- How to properly prepare the wood panel with a primer.
- The products and tools used and why.
- How to use Art Resin to create a smooth, flawless, professional finish
- How and why to prepare a work surface
- How to prepare the wood panel or tile for the resin
- The products and tools she uses for resin and why she uses them
- How to level a piece for resin
- How to determine how much resin is needed for the dimensions of the piece
- How to mix the resin
- How to finish the edges
- How to use a butane torch to eliminate bubbles
- How to protect the piece to avoid dust settling into the resin
- · Curing resin
- · How to fix mistakes

The Artful Pen Ask Arty...



Dear Arty,

Have you heard about this most popular building in America that artists flock to... to paint?

Of course! Located on Bradley Wharf in the harbor town of Rockport, Massachusetts, it is the little red fishing shack at the end of Bearskin Neck.

It is a replica of a former fishing shack well known to students of art and art history as "the most often-painted building in America." The original structure was built in 1840 and destroyed in the Blizzard of 1978, but an exact replica was constructed that same year.

Built in the 1840s as Rockport was becoming home to a colony of artists and settlement of fishermen, the shack became a favorite subject of painters due to the composition and lighting of its location as well as being a symbol of New England maritime life. Painter Lester Hornby (1882–1956) is believed to be the first to call the shack "Motif Number 1," a reference to its being the favorite subject of the town's painters, and the name achieved general acceptance. Artists, both experienced and novice, appreciate its lines and charm, while sightseers flock to photograph it every day.

In the 1930s, painter John Buckley used the shack as his studio. He sold it to the town in 1945, dedicated "In 1945, the town of Rockport purchased the Motif as a monument to Rockporters who had served in the Armed Services." The town, recognizing its iconic value, has taken pains to preserve both its structure and appearance, finding a red paint which appears weather-beaten even when new, and keeping the area clear of overhead wires, traffic signs and advertising.

Not only has this iconic structure been a favorite in artist renderings, it has also been featured in other cultural media like the float modeled after it won first place in the 1933 Chicago World's Fair, a cameo in 'Finding Nemo' and 'The Proposal'. It even has its own festival, celebrating Rockport's arts and supporting local schools. It has been featured on a postage stamp, cigarette ad, and bourbon bottle.

I personally recommend making this destination a square in your travels to the North East, not for its "beauty" but more for a feeling of nostalgia and its place in American Art History. Perhaps even making it a part of your art history.
