Members. Mary Lynnes expanded to a family membership when she included her husband, Mark Lynnes. We are pleased to have this family's creative talents in a variety of mediums to share at the Gallery. Mary paints in acrylics and oils and Mark works with stained glass, does wood working, paints and writes. **Welcome!**

Thank you Louise Ryan for the awesome demonstration on Resin Art.

Louise showed us how she creates beautiful and sometimes dreamy art with alcohol ink on yupo paper, then covering it with a resin. This is quite a process that she has developed creating works using resin over photography or paint on tiles or birch wood. At our demo, Louise attached her artwork onto a birch wood block and pressed down and used a tool to smooth out all the wrinkles. She used painter tape to cover the sides and back so resin wouldn't stick there when poured. Once the art was meticulously in place she mixed the resin for precisely 3 minutes, so no bubbles would occur. Then she poured it on to the art. Louise even used a torch to smooth the resin to ensure there would be no bubbles. She said that she covers it and lets it sit overnight...often looking at it after 12 hours to check on it. The end result is a beautiful piece of art that can be displayed anywhere. Louise did include the cautionary aspect of paying attention to the safety labels during this project. But the end result is fantastic!!

The Artful Pen Ask Arty...



Dear Arty,

I was at an art faire recently where I saw these beautiful and unique clothing and fabrics made in "batik". What exactly is that?

Batik is both an art and a craft and is a wonderfully creative medium. The word batik originates from the Javanese tik and means to dot. The art of decorating cloth in this way, using wax and dye, has been practised for centuries.

Evidence of early examples of batik have been found in the Far East, Middle East, Central Asia and India from over 2000 years ago. Indonesia, most particularly the island of Java, is the area where batik has reached the greatest peak of accomplishment and some of the finest batik cloth in the world is still made there.

Batik was practised in China as early as the Sui Dynasty (AD 581-618). These were silk batiks and these have also been discovered in Nara, Japan in the form of screens and ascribed to the Nara period (AD 710-794). It is probable that these were made by Chinese artists. They are decorated with trees, animals, flute players, hunting scenes and stylised mountains.

To make a batik, selected areas of the cloth are blocked out by brushing or drawing hot wax over them, and the cloth is then dyed. The parts covered in wax resist the dye and remain the original colour. This process of waxing and dyeing can be repeated to create more elaborate and colourful designs. After the final dyeing the wax is removed and the cloth is ready for wearing or showing.

Contemporary batik, while owing much to the past, is markedly different from the more traditional and formal styles. For example, the artist may use etching, discharge dyeing, stencils, different tools for waxing and dyeing, wax recipes with different resist values and work with silk, cotton, wool, leather, paper or even wood and ceramics.

Batik is historically the most expressive and subtle of the resist methods. The ever widening range of techniques available offers the artist the opportunity to explore a unique process in a flexible and exciting way. Computerisation of batik techniques is a very recent development but I prefer the more traditional methods.
