Featured Artists of the Month -

Real and Surreal Images from Ted and Doug Foss

Doug and Ted Foss (Doug the son) are exhibiting at the Antioch Fine Arts Foundation. Doug is strictly photography while Ted will have both his photography and paintings on display.

Doug has been helping his father; it seems, ever since he could walk. They would go out and photograph together, as Doug remembers, in the worse kind of weather with anywhere between a 35mm camera to 4x5 view cameras. When they weren't photographing outside they were working in the studio. Ted loved the darkroom work but Doug liked the shooting much better.

Ted started doing professional work (with Doug's help) for over thirty years, having done food photography, giclees, landscapes, wildlife, model portfolios and general advertising work. He owns his own advertising agency. His clients have included Lawter International, Millen Industries, lovite Corporation, Alvar Incorporated, and Ampac,Inc among others. He has also done photojournalism. His fiction and nonfiction has also been published. He currently has a video production company. His favorite photography is still landscapes and wildlife.

Doug, on the other hand, took a hiatus from photography for a few years but has come back super strong since the advent of digital. He then decided to really part ways with his father and does abstract work, which still has Ted scratching his head. He loves to manipulate images in order to peak the viewers interest and he certainly makes the viewer look twice and even three times at his work. Other photographers often ask him how he either shoots the image or his techniques in producing the final work.

Doug's website is 'fossimage.com', Ted's is 'artbyfoss.com'. Ted's part of the show is 'Yellowstone through Ted Foss' Eyes' And Doug's is 'Contrast'.

The Artful Pen Ask Arty...



I am excited to be starting a new painting class. What Kind of Easel Should I Get?

Dear Toby,

Nothing beats an easel for keeping a painting in place while you're working on it. Working vertically also means you're working in the same plane as the painting will finally be hung, reduces the risk of spilling anything on it, or

dust collecting on it. You can work sitting on a stool, or standing which allows you to step back to see how the painting is progressing.

Easels come in a variety of sizes and styles. The type of easel you get depends on the kind of painting you do the most. If you like working on large-scale canvases, then a table-top easel is unsuitable. If you enjoy standing to paint, then consider a floor-standing easel. And if you paint very vigorously, you'll want a heavy easel for stability.

Additionally, if you paint only with watercolors, there are easels specifically designed for the medium that offers a more versatility of angles, tilting from upright to flat. Oil paintings really should be stationed more vertically so as to collect less dust. Acrylics dry quickly so collecting dust is not a problem, however, if working in Pastels, a solid sturdy easel is recommended as Pastels can produce a fair amount of dust.

Here are a few to consider:

Table-Top Easels - Great for small spaces and small-scale paintings. They can be folded up and are available in various forms with some having storage boxes. Similarly, Sketchbox or Paintbox Easels are a variation on a table-top easel with a storage box and the lid of the box has a lip on which to stand your canvas.

Studio Easels – These are large, floor-standing easels that can accommodate big canvases. The ones with a square foot (H-frame) are more stable than the ones with three legs but don't fold up as quickly. Studio easels can get really huge, heavy, and expensive!

French Easels – Are a three-in-one easel: a sketch box, an easel, and a canvas carrier. The sketch box holds your painting supplies, the legs and canvas-holding arm collapse to make it easy to carry and transport.

Sketching, Portable, and Display Easels – These lightweight easels are handy for taking outdoors as they fold down to a small size. Display easels are made for showing a painting and tend to be a bit flimsy for working on.

Keep in mind the price of easels vary, from inexpensive sketching and display easels going up to large-scale studio easels. If you're only just starting out, a table-top or sketching easel should be sufficient. But if you have grand ambitions, then a floor-standing easel, though expensive, could be *just the thing to inspire!*
