I started painting in kindergarten and am on Medicare for several years now, the bio request always throws me. I can say that all things related to the fine arts have always intrigued me. Between then and now there have been watercolors, colored pencils, watercolor pencils, acrylics, pastels, clay, mosaics, oil paint, wood burning, fashion illustration, murals, and decorative wall work. The Millennium I did a globe for Chicago's Cool Globes environmentally motivated public art project. I used a bricolage approach, diverse materials, improvising and transforming found objects to make something special.

I also began working in salvaged styrofoam and cardboard packaging. I use paint and embellishments of objects, discards, fragments of previous work and dollar store stickers for surprising unexpected results. My latest installation Versailles Antioch is a good example. A new refrigerator provided the Styrofoam and a Versailles historical drama inspired the project. I noted color schemes, fashions of dress and attitude, landscape and architecture. Then I did my version of the moats, gardens and royal residences. Some of the embellishments came from the grounds, others from decorative discards or clearance bins, the local Antioch layer. Art has been my companion through my life, my past and my future and what I do in my now. Even when I travel, another passion I developed early, I always work. I always seek out art and other artists to find inspiration, collaboration and mutual understanding. I hope to remain a working artist the rest of my life and if I get another one I would do it all over again.
